Industries Department - Establishment of Centre for Perishable Cargo (CPC) for agriculture export promotion at Kozhikkode International Airport - Permission granted to M/s Kerala State Industrial Enterprises Limited - Orders Issued.

ORDER

As per the Government Order read above, administrative sanction was accorded to the State Horticulture Mission - Kerala for two projects viz. 'Establishment of Centre for Perishable Cargo (CPC) for Agriculture Export Promotion' and 'Creation of Integrated Supply Chain of Fruits and Vegetables for major cities of Kerala' under NABARD RIDF XXVII for an eligible total financial outlay (eligible TFO) of ₹33.5093 Crores (Rupees Thirty three crore fifty lakh and ninety three thousand only) out of which NABARD RIDF loan amounts to ₹31.8339 Crores (Rupees Thirty one crore eighty three lakh and thirty nine thousand only) and share of Government of Kerala amounts to Rs.1.6754 Crore (Rupees One crore sixty seven lakh and fifty four thousand only)

2) The State Horticulture Mission-Kerala, the Nodal Implementing Agency of the project has issued detailed working instructions as per the Circular read above, for the implementation of projects through the integration of state agencies such as HORTICORP, Vegetable and Fruit

Promotion Council Kerala (VFPCCK), Kerala Land Development Corporation (KLDC), Primary Agriculture Credit Societies, Kerala State Industrial Enterprises Limited and Kannur International Airport Limited.

3) The Managing Director, M/s Kerala State Industrial Enterprises Limited as per letter read above, has informed that the cost of CPC at Thiruvananthapuram is Rs.673.23 Lakhs and that of Kozhikkode is Rs.613.11 Lakhs of which the grant through RIDF assistance would be Rs.336.62 Lakh for Thiruvananthapuram and Rs.306.56 Lakh for Kozhikkode respectively which comes to 50% of the project cost in each project and KSIE would be making use of its own fund at 25% and avail term loan at 75% towards the balance 50% of the cost. He requested to accord sanction to KSIE to move ahead on the matter of setting up of CPC at Kozhikkode and the case of Thiruvananthapuram may be kept in abeyance for technical reasons.

4. Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to accord permission to M/s Kerala State Industrial Enterprises Limited for setting up of a Centre for Perishable Cargo (CPC) at Kozhikkode Air Cargo Complex at a total cost of Rs.613.11 Lakh of which grant through NABARD RIDF XXVII assistance would be Rs.306.56 Lakh with a direction that, KSIE should complete the project within the tenure of the tranche and submit bills without fail for the full utilization of NABARD funds as unutilisation of NABARD funds will adversely affect the future fund flow to the State.
